






What do the patterns on the Palestinian Keffiyah mean?



The fishnet pattern – represents the
Palestinians' connection to the sea. Also
thought to be a symbol of collectivism –
knotted individuals, stronger together.
The resemblance to barbed wire a fitting
nod to their 75+ year occupation.

Bold lines along the keffiyah - represent
trade routes across historic Palestine
which made the region a hub for
exchange. Others believe the lines
represent the walls that surround the
land, obstructing their freedom.
